7.1 Chair update / new member welcome

Ed welcomed new members followed by roundtable introductions.

7.2 Apeldoorn subcommittee update

Miles provided the following update:

- Elementary school art exchange is in progress and the art from both Apeldoorn and Burlington students will be displayed during the Canada Netherlands Friendship Day event.
- Student travel exchange will resume in 2020 with a small group of Burlington high school students travelling to Apeldoorn in May and Apeldoorn students travelling to Burlington in October. The Apeldoorn subcommittee and Burlington committee in Apeldoorn are planning meaningful activities and projects for the students to collaborate on with the theme being the 75th anniversary of the liberation of Holland.
- A member of the Burlington committee in Apeldoorn will be in Burlington for a few days in May.
- **Motion** - to spend up to \$2000 towards the Canada Netherlands Friendship Day event. (expenses include chair rental, audio equipment, light refreshments, school buses, promotion). Carried.

### 7.3 Itabashi subcommittee update

Rob provided the following update:

- Plans continue for the Sakura Festival. It was suggested that the subcommittee consider an upgrade to the audio equipment to provide improved sound for this year's event.
- Motion - to spend up to \$3000 towards the Sakura Festival event. (expenses include venue rental, performers, light refreshments) Carried.
- Plans continue for the Itabashi/Burlington official and citizen delegation travel to take place in 2019.
- Information sessions are being held at 7 p.m. at City Hall on Apr. 4 and May 23 for citizens considering joining the citizen tour to Japan in October.
- Homestays are being arranged for the 11 students travelling from Itabashi to Burlington Aug. 14 -20. Members are asked to spread the word regarding potential homestays.
- The Itabashi Garden construction is underway. Parks and Open Space staff will attend the next committee meeting to provide an overview. On Apr. 6 a public information session will be held at Tansley Woods Community Centre to provide an overview of the Garden design and construction.

- Staff has requested a letter from the Mayor's office to thank Mr. Taroo Enomoto for his generous monetary donation towards the purchase of azaleas for the Itabashi Garden.
- Elementary student artwork from Fujimidai school in Itabashi and Tecumseh Public School in Burlington will be displayed at the Art Gallery of Burlington during the month of May. On May 2 the student's principal, teachers and families will be invited to a 'celebration of art' with guest speaker Suzanne Carte, Senior Curator.
