7.1 Itabashi subcommittee meeting

Rob provided the subcommittee update:

- Chuck Morris has announced that he is resigning from the committee. Rob thanked him for his years of volunteering.
- Dan McNeil representing the wood carvers guild displayed gift items
 that were made from the sakura trees that were removed from
 Spencer Smith Park. The guild is working with the Art Gallery of
 Burlington to establish a permanent area/shelf for the items made from
 the sakura trees.
- Upcoming events include

 - On October 8 at 7pm at Central Library, guest speaker Toshi
 Aoyagi will provide a talk on Japanese woodblock prints.
 - Engaged Buddhism discussion at Central Library on October 30 at 7pm.
 - Japanese Tea Ceremony at Central Library on November 2 at 1pm
- Rob requested a meeting with communication staff to develop a template for upcoming events. Suzanne will arrange a meeting.
- Official and Citizen visit to Itabashi is coming up on October 15.
- The student exchange form Japan was a huge success. The highlight was the show after the day with Student Theatre.

7.2 Apeldoorn subcommittee meeting

Anne provided the subcommittee update:

- The student exchange from Apeldoorn will arrive on October 5.
- On May 2, 2020 to May 11, students from Burlington will travel to Apeldoorn.
- Currently working on confirming schools for the pen pal and art exchange, Pineland Scool is confirmed. The theme of the art is 'what does peace mean to you'. Art from Burlington students that is going to Apeldoorn will be hung in the Het Loo Palace.
- There are 3 students committed for the international youth exchange, there is still room for a 4th student. The school board does not support this initiative due to students being billeted.

- The citizen delegation will travel to Apeldoorn in May 2020 there is a committee in Apledoorn currently working on the program.
- The tentative date for Canada Netherlands Friendship day is May 30 at Tansley Woods or the Art Gallery.
- Work is underway to design a commemorative pin for the 15th anniversary of twinning.
- Dutch-Indonesian game night is on Saturday November 2 at the Seniors' Centre. \$40.00 tickets, dinner, games, and a silent auction to raise money to help cover the costs of the student exchange.

7.3 United Nations subcommittee meeting

- Model UN Day is taking place at Robert Bateman High School on October 24. Registration is open, 75 students have already registered but hoping or 300.
- The Lieutenant Governor of Ontario Elizabeth Dowdeswell is confirmed as the guest speaker.
