BSAC representative on the Burlington Accessibility Advisory Committee (BAAC) and Burlington Inclusivity Advisory Committee (BIAC)	<ul> <li>Jim advised that a BSAC representative is required on both the Burlington Accessibility Advisory Committee (BAAC) and the Burlington Inclusivity Advisory Committee (BIAC) and asked if there was any interest from members.</li> <li>Joan Gallagher-Bell expressed interest in being the representative for BIAC. Jo-Anne to provide meeting details to Joan.</li> <li>There was no interest for BAAC so Jo-Anne will continue to provide updates to committee.</li> </ul>	
6. Delegation for January 16 Committee of the Whole – Budget meeting	<ul> <li>Councillor Meed Ward provided an overview of the budget process and advised that she will be bringing the following three motions forward:         <ol> <li>Consider recommendations from BSAC Transit Paper in the overall Transit Review.</li> <li>Free transit for seniors during off-peak hours Monday to Friday.</li> <li>Costs, operational impacts and potential sponsorship opportunities to provide transit service on December 25 and January 1.</li> </ol> </li> <li>Advocacy sub-committee will discuss potential sponsorship possibilities.</li> <li>Jim T. advised that Jim Y. will delegate on behalf of BSAC at the January 16 budget meeting.</li> </ul>	
7. Adult Program Update	No report.	

Discussion re: new sub- committee	<ul> <li>Jim T. advised that he met with Mandy before the holidays to discuss the possibility of a new subcommittee that will explore 55+ issues related to recreation. Mandy suggested that a broader focus of Social and Civic Participation would clearly align with forthcoming recommendations from the Burlington Active Aging Plan and could offer a more comprehensive perspective under which recreation, festivals and events, community based services and volunteerism would fit well. This subcommittee could align with city work plans providing input and advice on initiatives.</li> <li>Jim T. advised that Mandy and two other recreation staff will attend February's meeting to provide social and civic participation-related work plans.</li> </ul>	On motion, the committee agreed to form a new subcommittee called "Social and Civic Participation".
9. Sub-committee Reports	<ul> <li>Jim Y. advised that he and Jim T. met with the Mayor before the holidays regarding the Transit Paper and noted that the Mayor commended BSAC for their work and indicated that there is money in the budget for Transit staff to complete a Transit Strategy in 2017. The Mayor suggested that "Affordable Housing for Seniors" be a topic for the subcommittee to work on.</li> <li>Councillor Meed Ward advised that the City has inclusionary zoning for new developments to include affordable housing and explained the Region's and City's role. She would be pleased to take any ideas to Regional Council.</li> <li>Communications Sub-committee</li> <li>Kim advised that they did ten presentations in the community in 2016 and have another planned for January 11 at St. Luke's Parish Hall. Vials continue to be popular.</li> <li>Kim asked if the font on the posters could be increased as seniors were having difficulty reading the small print.</li> </ul>	Jo-Anne to speak with graphics staff re: posters.

10. Roundtable	<ul> <li>Jim T. advised that OAAC is putting together their workplan for 2017.</li> <li>Jim Y. advised that he was pleased with ITAC's comments regarding the Transit Paper.</li> <li>Tom advised that CARP will be holding two forums entitled "Aging Wisely" – March 11 and March 18 at Queen Elizabeth Park Community Centre in Oakville.
