Re: Parking relief under extenuating circumstances

Colleagues,

It is appreciated that the parking permit system was not adopted City wide and I continue to believe that was appropriate at the time.

Meanwhile, the concept of a permit being made available under extenuating circumstances across the City will be very much appreciated. Staff has evaluated a number of requests from individuals who are challenged to provide parking for reasons such as long term care givers needing more than 5 hours parking, or visiting family members who stay for a period in excess of 15 days. Staff proposed provision of a temporary permit under circumstances they find supportable and I agree it provides a compassionate solution.

Accordingly, in consultation with the City Clerk I recommend the below motion:

Direct the Director of Transportation Services to introduce a temporary street permit to assist residents who have a need to park on the street due to extenuating circumstances; and

Monitor the temporary permit and report to Council with the results in the Fall of 2017 along with the results of the Residential Street Permit Program.
