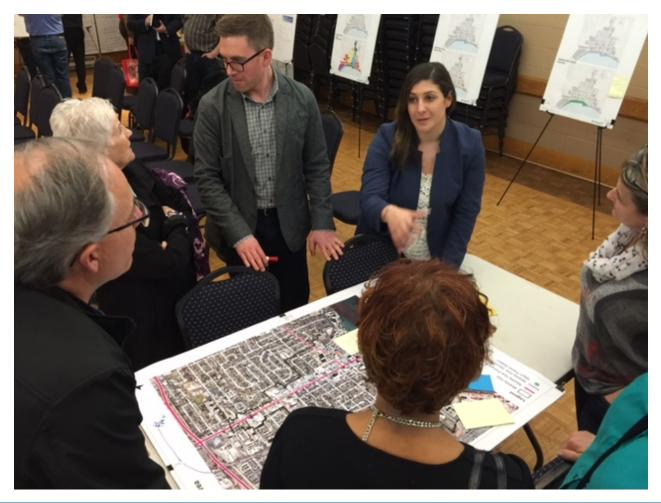

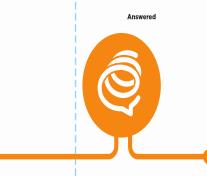
Managing your project communications

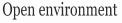
Controlled environment

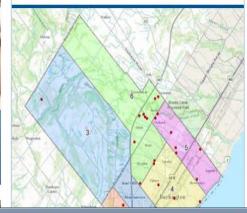
