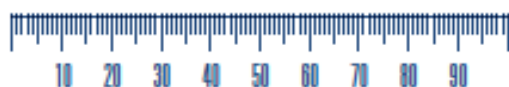
Share the Road envisions a future in which Ontario is the most bicycle friendly place in North America.

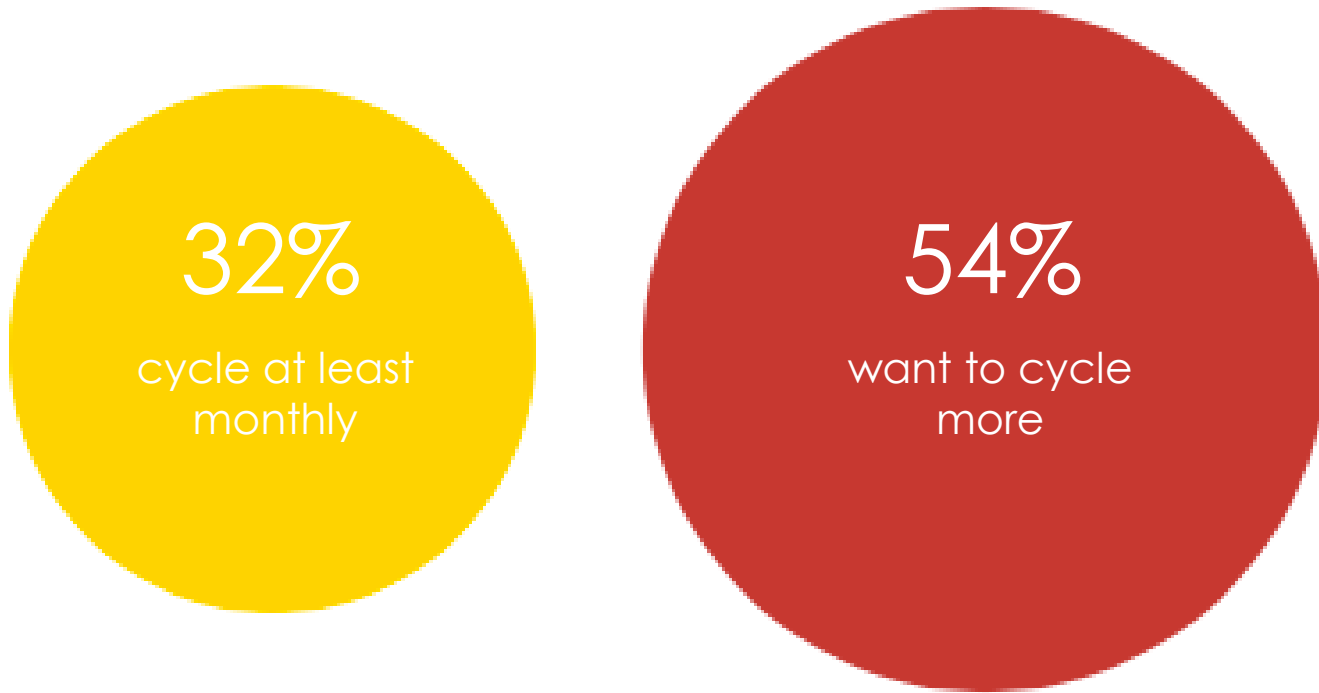

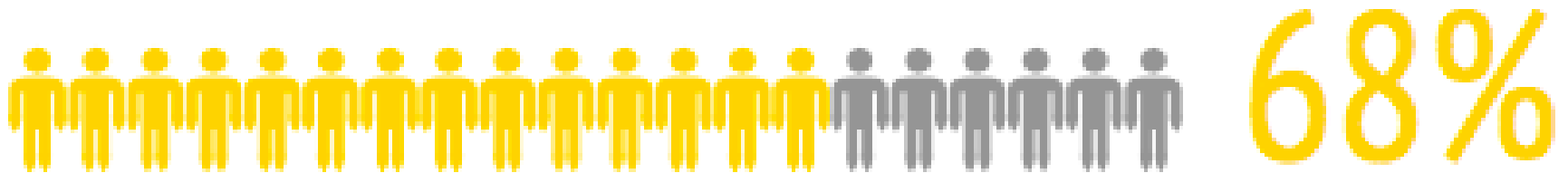
Demand for Cycling in Ontario

68% of Ontario residents support investments in new cycling infrastructure

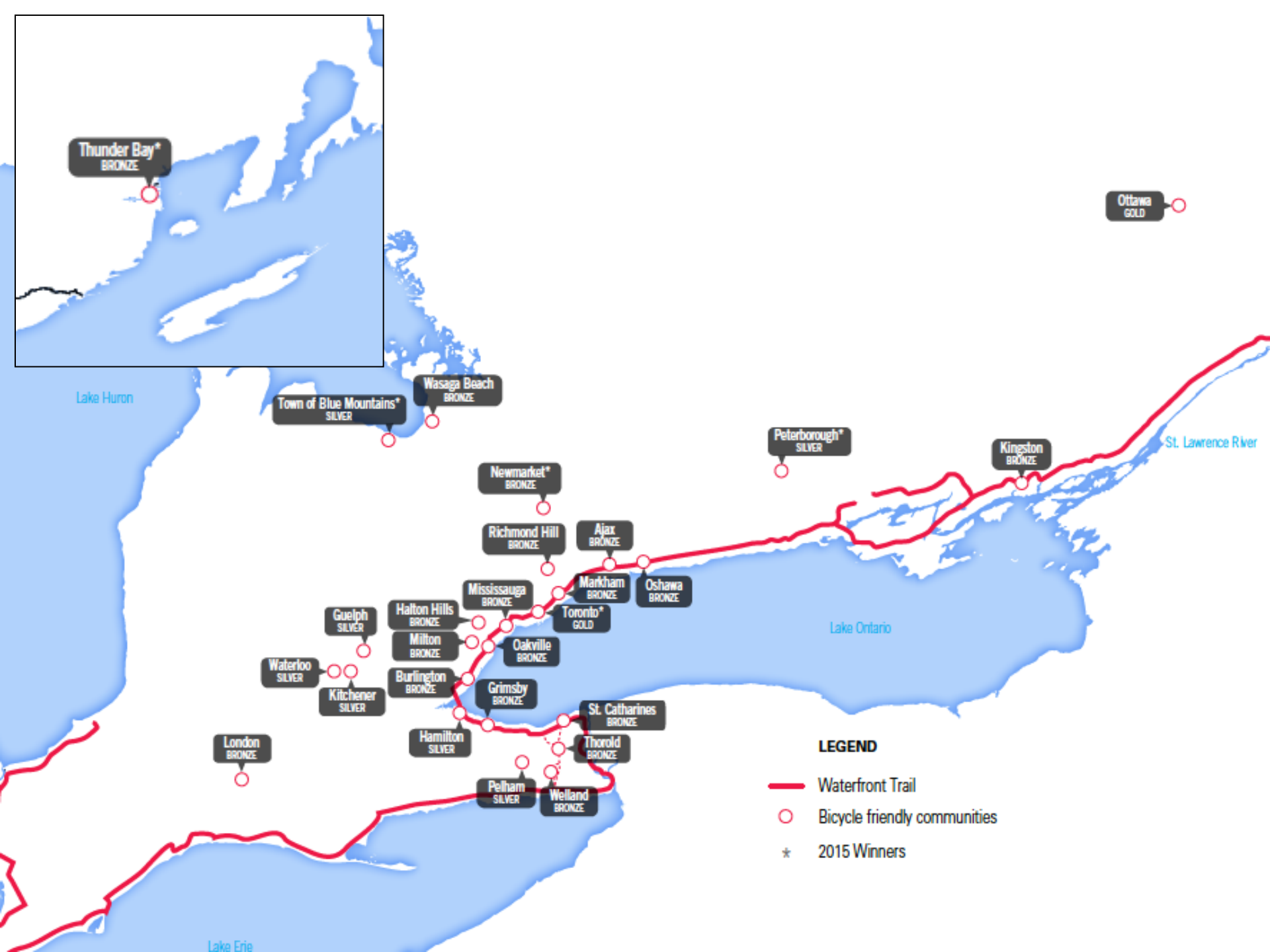

9 on-road bike counters and 6 counters on trails, planned raised cycle tracks

Next Steps and Inspiration



Prioritize installation of all ages and abilities bike infrastructure that helps people get **to key destinations** like downtown and the mall



Leverage **quieter neighbourhood streets** to develop network of bike boulevards or neighbourhood greenways



Ensure **municipal employees are safe driving ambassadors** by providing education about sharing the road with people on bikes



Invite **law enforcement** to join the Bicycle Advisory Committee

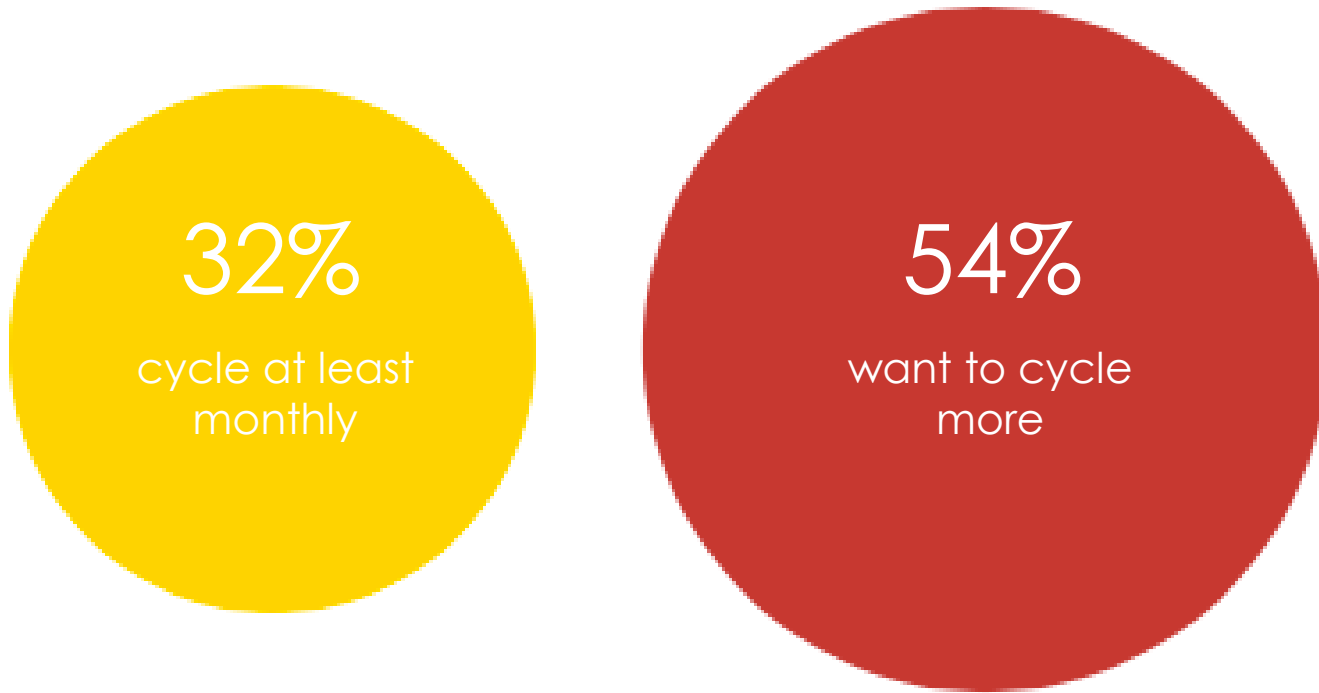


Host a series of “**rediscover your ride**” events to encourage residents to explore their community by bike
