I recently contacted my City Councillor, Kelvin Galbraith regarding the new policy by the city to have **a single provider** for youth competitive swimming. Councillor Galbraith directed me to send my concerns into the city clerk.

As a life long Burlington resident and a parent, I have the following concerns regarding the new "Framework for Community Recreation":

1. Can you please explain the reasoning behind the decision to have only one competitive swimming provider?

As a parent, I would like to choose the competitive swimming provider that suits my family. I do not believe the city should make this decision for me.

- 2. Has thought been given to those Burlington residents whose club is <u>not</u> chosen as the single provider? Where will their children train if they cannot practice at Burlington pools?
- 3. Why was a bid package issued on January 28th if committee has not discussed or approved the new "Framework for Community Recreation"?
- 4. Were any Burlington competitive swimming clubs contacted or consulted during the Framework research?
- 5. Why has Aldershot pool not been considered a location for youth competitive swimming? This is our closest pool in Ward 1.
- 6. Will this single provider policy extend to hockey & baseball teams/clubs and the use of Burlington skating rinks and baseball diamonds? If not, why has competitive swimming and pool use been chosen for this policy?

I hope my concerns will be read and discussed at the meeting on February	10, 2020.
