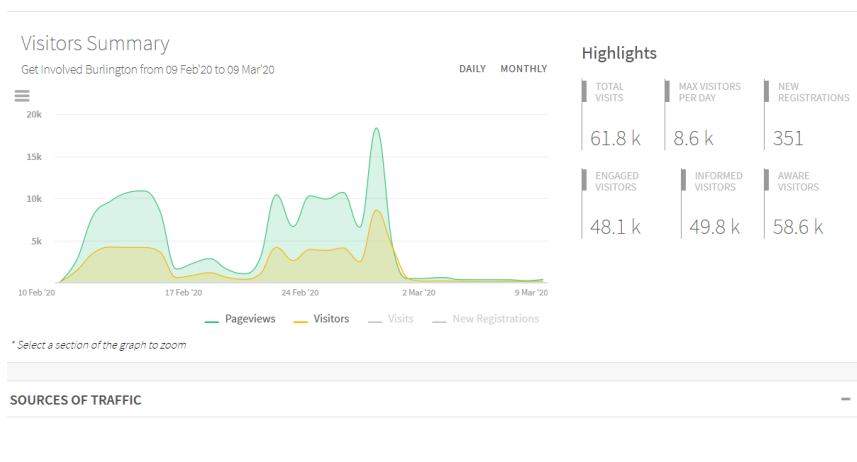


Significant Strides Made in Engagement

By the spring of 2020, Burlington City Council will vote to endorse changes to the policies in Burlington's adopted Official Plan that guide development in the downtown until 2031, including the height and density of buildings.

To assist Council in making their decision, the City is committed to leading an open and transparent public engagement process to ensure the voices of people from every corner of the city are heard and valued.
