Mr. Chairman, Members of Council and Delegations:

My name is Deborah Gutman and I am representing Janice Brewer, a homeowner at 2121 Lakeshore Road, Burlington, Ontario.

Below are issues and items of concern to be addressed:

- <u>Road Congestion:</u> The 2-lane road which currently has high traffic congestion during peak hours, especially backup from the bridge, will be negatively impacted by the Development;
- <u>Building Height:</u> Current Building Code restricts structures greater than 7 stories. Due to the area's old world character and quaintness, a development of 28 stories would not only impact water views and create shaded areas, but impact the old world charm of the area;
- <u>Negative Impact During Construction:</u> The redevelopment, would impact the area as follows:
  - Closed roads for unlimited periods of time/years;
  - > Parking issues, noise and land vibrations;
  - ➤ Construction and noise will infringe upon the lifestyle of residents
- Mayor's Election Promises: Mayor Marianne Meed Ward was elected based on a promise of restricting large developments that do not meet current code. Traffic congestion and current infrastructure do not support large developments;

- <u>Current Negative Impact:</u> The Bridgewater Condominium project (Rosseau Group) underway and adjoining the waterfront hotel is still incomplete after 5 years. It remains a major disruption in the area due to traffic congestion and construction debris;
- <u>Storage and Garbage</u>: A Garbage Removal Loading Space is shown on the Site Plan. What measures will be taken to enclose same and keep area clean?
