Motion:

Support the application of Backed By Bees honey winery for a Manufacturer's Limited Liquor Sales Licence for By the Glass.

Background and Discussion:

City staff and BEDC have been working closely with Backed by Bees for the past year and a half to support them in establishing an on-farm market and meadery, with a vision of providing sustainably sourced local food and drink and connecting people to the land. Backed by Bees has obtained all of the necessary planning approvals (i.e. Niagara Escarpment Development Permit and City Zoning Clearance Certificate) and staff are strongly supportive of this excellent opportunity for on-farm diversification and rural economic development. For Council's reference, a similar resolution was passed in support of Nickel Brook Brewing Co. on September 24, 2018 (see [item 14.4](#)).

On-Site Honey Winery Retail Store Authorization

Pursuant to section 3 of the *Liquor Control Act* the Registrar of Alcohol, Gaming and Racing has authorized the Winery to operate a Retail Store for the retail sale of its Ontario wine to the public, which has been made at the Production Site set out below. - The Winery must own or lease and operate a minimum of 100 bee colonies and must at all times possess a valid Beekeeper’s Certificate of Registration issued by the Provincial Apiarist under the Bees Act.
- (a) The honey extracting site must be located at the productions site and the Winery’s wine may only be sold in conjunction with the Winery’s honey products.
 (b) All of the wine for sale at the Retail Store (“Winery Store”) must be made from honey which comes from the bee colonies owned or leased and operated by the Winery and which is produced at the production site.
- The Winery must make at the production site all wine that is available for sale in the Winery Store. The question of whether a particular wine has been “made” at the production site by the Winery shall be determined in accordance with applicable policies of the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (“AGCO”).
- All wine made available for sale in the Winery Store by the Winery shall be Ontario wine, as that term is defined in the Liquor Licence Act.
- The Winery Store must remain at the production site, adjacent to the wine manufacturing facility.
- The Winery Store shall be operated solely under the direction and control of the Winery.
- The Winery Store will open and close for business in accordance with the days and hours set from time to time by the Registrar.
- The Winery may use the services of a Carrier to deliver liquor from the Winery Store to:
 - the residence of the recipient, or
 - the recipient’s place of business, if such place is an indoor place to which the public is not ordinarily invited or permitted access, in accordance with these conditions.





10. Liquor shall only be delivered by the Carrier, who shall be deemed to be the agent of the Winery for the purposes of the Authorization. The Winery shall be responsible for the Carrier's compliance with these Conditions.
11. The Carrier shall only deliver liquor which has been purchased from the Winery and paid for prior to being picked up by the Carrier.
12. The Winery shall ensure that the price of liquor to be delivered under the Authorization is the same as the price for the liquor sold in the Winery Store. The Winery shall charge a delivery fee for liquor delivered under the Authorization that is not less than the reasonable cost to the Winery of the Carrier's delivery services.
13. Liquor may only be delivered to a recipient if the purchaser has previously provided the Winery Store with a purchase order ("Purchase Order") for such liquor that includes, at a minimum, the name and delivery address of the recipient and a statement that the recipient is at least 19 years of age. Purchase Orders for liquor shall be accepted only at the Winery Store.
14. All deliveries of liquor must originate from the Winery Store. The Carrier must deliver the liquor on the same day as it is picked up from the Winery Store or on the first regular delivery day thereafter, subject to the provisions of paragraph 18 relating to re-attendances to complete delivery.
15. Except as provided in paragraph 16, the Carrier shall not warehouse or Store liquor pending delivery.
16. The Carrier may temporarily keep liquor in a secure area at its premises until the delivery of such liquor to the recipient is completed or returned to the Winery Store. Only the Carrier's employees may have access to the liquor while it is kept at such premises.
17. The Winery shall ensure that liquor is delivered only to an individual at the residence of the recipient or to an individual at the recipient's place of business, provided that such place of business is an indoor place to which the public is not ordinarily invited or permitted access.
18. Liquor shall not be left with anyone unless the Carrier determines that the recipient or another individual who lives at or is regularly employed at the place of delivery is at least 19 years of age. If the recipient or other individual appears to be under 19 years of age, the Carrier shall examine proof of age from the recipient or other individual. Acceptable forms of identification are set out in subsection 41(5) of Ontario Regulation 719 made under the Liquor Licence Act.

The Receipt must contain the name and address of the recipient, the name and signature of the person receiving the liquor and the date of delivery. If there is no such individual present when the Carrier initially attempts to deliver the liquor, the Carrier may make further attempts to complete the delivery within three days following the initial attempt, failing which the liquor must be returned to the Winery Store.
