

SUBJECT: FIT (Feed-in Tariff) Support Resolution for Rooftop Solar Projects

Recommendation:

Approve the municipal blanket support resolution for rooftop solar FIT (Feed-in Tariff) projects attached as Appendix A to Capital Works Report CW-46-16.

Purpose:

Supports the strategic plan through:

- A Healthy and Greener City
- Environmental and Energy Leadership

Background and Discussion:

Ontario's Green Energy Act (GEA) was created in 2009 to expand renewable energy generation, encourage energy conservation and promote the creation of clean energy jobs. It is under this legislation that the government introduced the FIT (Feed-in Tariff) and microFIT programs to help stimulate renewable energy projects in the province by entering into contracts with homeowners, businesses and community groups to buy back the green energy produced by these projects.

Proponents of FIT renewable energy projects receive priority points if they receive municipal support through a council resolution. Burlington City Council has approved municipal blanket support resolutions for rooftop solar projects for the last three FIT application periods (see reports CSI-17-12, CSI-26-113 and CW-14-15).

Information provided in report CW-13-16 earlier this year noted that Burlington had just under 6 MW of installed renewable energy (mainly solar), enough to power just under 1,000 households (this number is dependent on hours of sunlight and average household electricity consumption). This is an increase from 4 MW reported last year.

It is expected that the Independent Electricity System Operator (IESO) will open the FIT program (FIT 5) to new applications for renewable energy projects in November 2016 and the window for applications is usually time sensitive. The wording of municipal support resolutions must match the wording provided in the template provided by the IESO. The City of Burlington's previous resolution expired in May 2016. Therefore, staff are recommending approval of the attached resolution in Appendix A for the FIT 5 application process for rooftop solar projects only.

This municipal resolution does not, however, negate the requirement for the proponent to obtain a building permit, ensuring conformity with the Ontario Building Code.

Other types of green energy projects such as ground mounted solar panels greater than 10 kW would require a municipal resolution on a case by case basis, requiring a staff review in order to be awarded municipal support under the FIT application process. During the FIT 2, 3 and 4 application processes, there were no requests for a municipal resolution outside the scope of the blanket resolution approved by the City of Burlington, such as ground mounted solar projects.

Strategy/process

If approved by council, the municipal support resolution will be posted on-line at <u>www.burlington.ca/environment</u> to be downloaded by renewable energy proponents to include in their FIT applications to the IESO (Independent Electricity System Operator).

Financial Matters:

There are no financial implications to the City of Burlington by approving the municipal blanket support resolution supporting rooftop solar projects in Burlington.

Connections:

Approving the attached municipal resolution supports the following goal in Burlington's Community Energy Plan: Increase sustainable local energy generation in Burlington and enhance supply security, in ways that support Burlington's economic competitiveness.

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Public Engagement Matters:

Information related to this initiative will be posted on the city's website.

Conclusion:

The approval of the attached municipal resolution for rooftop solar panel installations in Burlington provides proponents the ability to achieve priority points from the IESO for their green energy project. It supports actions in the city's Strategic Plan as well as the Community Energy Plan.
