Direct the City Clerk to forward Council's Resolution, subject to the endorsement of community planning report PL-22-21, to the Niagara Escarpment Commission (NEC); and

Direct the City Clerk to forward community planning department report PL-22-21 to the Joint Agency Review Team.

# **Background and Discussion:**

### 1.0 Niagara Escarpment Plan Amendment (NEPA) Application Process

A Niagara Escarpment Plan Amendment (NEPA) Application (PH 219 20) has been received by the Niagara Escarpment Commission (NEC) as it relates to the proposed expansion of the existing Burlington Nelson Quarry. The application contemplates a redesignation of approximately 78.30 hectares (193.50 acres) of land from 'Escarpment Rural Area' to 'Mineral Resource Extraction Area'.

The purpose of the application is to affect a special policy to the current extraction site that would permit the continuation of aggregate processing operations in conjunction with the proposed expansion, and to facilitate the continued use of the existing aggregate processing and maintenance facilities on the existing site for the processing of material extracted from the proposed expansion lands.

The applicants have applied for an annual tonnage condition of 2,000,000 tonnes for the expanded portion of the quarry, as has been included in a separate circulation of a Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry *Aggregate Resources Act (ARA)* License Application.

The NEPA Application was submitted concurrent with applications to amend the Region of Halton Official Plan and the City of Burlington Official Plan.

# 2.0 Environmental Registry of Ontario (ERO)(ERO No. 019-3215)

On February 24, 2021, a request for comments was posted to the Environmental Registry of Ontario (ERO), pursuant to the *Niagara Escarpment Planning and Development Act*, which initiates a statutory 60-day period within which comments related to the NEPA Application are to be received and provided to the Niagara Escarpment Commission via mail or email. Instructions as to the manner in which comments are to be provided, including staff contact details, are available on the NEC website (<a href="www.escarpment.org">www.escarpment.org</a>). Comments are also being accepted through the online portal available on the Environmental Registry of Ontario website (<a href="www.ero.ontario.ca">www.ero.ontario.ca</a>). The deadline for the receipt of comments is April 26, 2021.

Notification of receipt of the Niagara Escarpment Plan Amendment Application was provided via publication in the Burlington Post and Milton Canadian Champion newspapers with information about the nature of the application and contact details for the submission of comments. Notification signs have been installed on the subject property(ies) advising of the receipt of the application.

A Public Meeting may be held, pursuant to the *Niagara Escarpment Planning and Development Act*, however, no details about a future public meeting have been determined.

#### 3.0 City of Burlington Correspondence

The application for a Niagara Escarpment Plan Amendment was submitted concurrent with applications pursuant to the *Aggregate Resources Act (ARA)* and *Planning Act*; notably, an application to amend the City of Burlington Official Plan.

A Joint Agency Review Team (JART) was established in 2020 to provide a framework for the coordination and review of the various applications by the applicable approval authority(ies). The JART is in the process of reviewing the technical specializations presented by the applications and providing responses to the applicant on these topic areas. The Region of Halton is providing a coordinating role and administering JART in the review of the applications.

In its initial review of the applications, City of Burlington staff has identified several areas concerning the proposal where either there has not been sufficient information or data provided; where analyses are not sufficiently coordinated with other key areas of review; or, where methodological bases of the information presented in the submitted plans, studies/reports remains undetermined or is inconsistent. Appendix 'A' - 'City of Burlington – Correspondence re: Burlington Nelson Quarry Extension' provides a preliminary summary of these comments.

The JART has provided an introductory set of technical comments for review and response by the applicant and anticipate a second submission in the near future.

The Niagara Escarpment Commission (NEC) is an active member of the JART and has provided technical advice and expertise in the review of the applications related to the proposed expansion of the Burlington Nelson Quarry.

Comments accepted as part of the NEPA review process will also be forwarded to the applicant for review and the responses may contribute to the preparation of an NEC Summary Report later in the process.

## **Climate Implications**

#### **Conclusion:**

Community Planning Department staff will continue a detailed review of the applications through the Joint Agency Review Team (JART) and provide updates to Council as to the status of the review and response(s) to items noted in the City's correspondence to the Niagara Escarpment Commission.

In the interim, Community Planning Department staff seek Council direction and endorsement of the draft response, as part of the ongoing reporting of City comments in relation to the proposed development.
