City of Burlington By-law 30-2022

A by-law to repeal By-law 17-2020 being a by-law to Promote and Regulate Physical  
Distancing During the COVID-19 Pandemic State of Emergency

Whereas sections 8, 9 and 11 of the *Municipal Act, 2001* authorize the City of Burlington to pass by-laws necessary and desirable for municipal purposes, and in particular, paragraphs 5, 6, and 8 of subsection 11(2) authorize by-laws respecting public assets of the municipality, the economic, social and environmental well-being of City, the health, safety and well-being of persons, the protection of persons and property; and

Whereas on April 6, 2020 Council of the City of Burlington passed By-law 17-2020 to promote and regulate physical distancing during the COVID-19 pandemic state of emergency; and

Whereas the Council of the City of Burlington deems it necessary to repeal By-law 17-2020, as amended by 067-2020, 007-2021 and 064-2021; and

Now therefore the Council of The Corporation of the City of Burlington hereby enacts as follows:

1. That By-law 17-2020, referred to as the “COVID-19 Physical Distancing By-law”, as amended by 067-2020, 007-2021 and 064-2021, is hereby repealed in its entirety.
2. This By-law shall come into force on the day of its passing.
