This letter serves as support in principle to the Hamilton 2030 Commonwealth Bid Group in their development of their competition and training facility plan for both the Games and the legacy from the Games. Specifically, Gymnastics Canada and Gymnastics Ontario are supportive of the work to date with the City of Burlington in respect to the development of a multi-sport training and competition site at 1200 King Road in Burlington.
