Recommendation:

Receive and file office of the city clerk report CL-17-22, closed session meeting investigation report from Aird and Berlis LLP.

PURPOSE:

This report is a transmittal report to provide the findings of the closed session meeting investigation conducted by Aird & Berlis LLP regarding four closed session meetings held between November 2021 and February 2022.

Background and Discussion:

As of January 1, 2008 any person or corporation may request that an investigation be undertaken questioning whether a municipality or local board, or a committee of either, has complied with closed meeting rules outlined in the *Municipal Act*, 2001.

Pursuant to Section 239(2) of the *Municipal Act*, 2001 (the Municipal Act), the City has appointed Local Authority Services Limited (LAS) to provide Closed Session meeting investigation services to the City. LAS is a subsidiary of the Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO). It is the role of the investigator to determine compliance with the Municipal Act or the City of Burlington's Procedure By-law with respect to closed meetings and provide a report on the results of such investigations.

LAS has retained and delegated authority to Aird & Berlis LLP (Aird & Berlis) to act as closed meeting investigator to its participating municipalities. As the closed meeting investigator, Aird & Berlis are authorized to conduct investigations on meetings or parts of meetings which are closed to the public.

Section 239 of the Municipal Act provides that all meetings of a municipality, including its Council, local boards, and committees, shall be open to the public. Section 239(2) includes a list of exceptions that may be considered in a session closed to the public. An excerpt of the Municipal Act section 239 is attached as Appendix A.

Section 27 of the City's Procedure By-law also speaks to Closed Sessions. In addition to the provisions in the Municipal Act, the Procedure By-law includes procedures for reporting out after a Closed Session meeting:

27.6 On reconvening in public session, the Chair will accept a motion regarding the matters discussed in closed session, or alternatively advise that direction had been given to staff during the closed session in accordance with the *Municipal Act*.

On February 15, 2022, a request was filed with the Office of the City Clerk to investigate four closed session meetings:

- Corporate Services, Strategy, Risk and Accountability Committee Meeting, November 10, 2021
- Corporate Services, Strategy, Risk and Accountability Committee Meeting, January 10, 2022
- City Council Meeting, January 18, 2022
- Corporate Services, Strategy, Risk and Accountability Committee Meeting, February 2, 2022

The scope of the request was to investigate the following issues:

- Were Council and the Committee entitled to discuss those matters identified in the Request in closed session pursuant to a closed meeting exception in subsection 239(2) of the Municipal Act, 2001; and
- Did Council and the Committee's "report out" resolution passed following each closed session comply with the Procedure By-law?

The request was provided to Aird & Berlis on March 2, 2022, and the report with the findings of their investigation is attached as Appendix B. The report from Aird & Berlis concludes that in all cases, the City of Burlington did not contravene subsection 239(2) of the Municipal Act or the City's Procedure By-law in respect to the issues identified in the request.
