6. Approval of Minutes:

6.1 Approve the minutes from the meeting held February 16, 2022

8.1 2020 Lakeshore comments

After a lengthy discussion on the recommendation and comments, this was referred back to the Policy and Development subcommittee for amendments and to be circulated for approval by this committee via email in order to meet the deadline.

9. Regular Items:

- 9.1 Council and staff updates:
 - a. Councillor Sharman

Councillor Sharman provided some comments and answered questions regarding the decision made at Regional Council on Halton Urban Boundary expansion and preferred growth concept. Councillor Sharman suggested that committee members could visit Local-News.ca to read an article he has written to express his views.

b. Lynn Robichaud - Sustainability

In addition to the attached written update, Lynn advised the committee of the following:

- The Home Energy Efficiency Retrofit Program was presented at the Environment, Infrastructure and Community Services Committee on March 3. Committee members unanimously supported the recommendation and were very excited to see this program implemented. Staff are proposing the approval of an additional staff person to support homeowners with a business case for the 2023 budget.
- The Electric Mobility Strategy page on Get Involved Burlington has been launched, there are 3 surveys available to participate in covering electric vehicles, e-bikes and e-scooters, there have already been a lot of responses with the surveys only being up a few days which is encouraging. BurlingtonGreen is currently setting up one-on-one meetings with stakeholders and members of Council.
- Plug'n Drive test drive event planned for a 4-week period starting on April 23 in Burlington
- A public draft of the Climate Resilient Burlington plan will be available on Get Involved Burlington, staff are looking for

feedback on the actions being proposed. A report on the plan will be presented at the May 5, 2022 EICS committee meeting.

- April 23, 2022 there will be an Earth Day event at Central Park with tree giveaways, Plug'n Drive and BurlingtonGreen visit burlington.ca to register for a free tree or to test drive an electric vehicle.
- Lynn will ask Paul Fletcher to represent SDC on the EV Steering Committee.
- c. John Stuart Community Planning

In addition to the attached written update, John advised the committee of the following:

- A Get Involved Burlington page is available with the Major Transit System Areas (MTSA) recommended preferred precinct plans. Future public engagement timelines will be posted on Get Involved Burlington when available, a project status update going to City Council is planned for May 2022.
- Kate Hill-Montague will be providing an update at the next P & D subcommittee meeting regarding the Housing Strategy.
- Work is re-starting on the Downtown Placemaking and Urban Design Guidelines and staff is anticipating that community engagement will be happening soon. John will bring a detailed update to the next P & D subcommittee meeting.
