

Appendix B of PL-08-23- Chronology of Council Decisions and Objections

On July 12, 2022, City Council considered [staff report PL-49-22 Proposed Downtown Cultural Heritage Landscapes Study](#) and authorized a year-long study of eight potential heritage properties and six potential cultural heritage landscapes (“CHLs”) identified in a 2019 Cultural Heritage Resource Assessment of the downtown. Council also added the eight potential heritage properties to the Heritage Register and directed staff to engage the Heritage Burlington Advisory Committee (the “HBAC”) and review all other properties within the study areas for possible inclusion on the Heritage Register. Consultation with HBAC is required by the *Ontario Heritage Act* before a property can be added to the Heritage Register.

Staff notified the eight property owners that their properties had been added to the Heritage Register and received one objection from the owner of 574 Brant Street.

At the September 13 Community Planning, Regulation & Mobility (“CPRM”) meeting, staff presented a report recommending that Council add 24 additional properties to the Heritage Register.

After the September 13 CPRM meeting, the owners of 426 Burlington Avenue, 620 Brant Street and 380 Brant Street and 372-374 Brant Street submitted objections.

At the September 20 City Council meeting, Council added 18 of the properties to the Heritage Register and directed staff to undertake additional consultation with the remaining six owners. Council directed staff to report back to the December 13, 2022 City Council meeting on results of consultation with these six owners.

After the September 20 Council meeting, the owners of 524 Locust Street and 458 Locust Street submitted objections.

At the December 13 City Council meeting, Council added the remaining six properties to the Heritage Register.

The owners of 2010 Maria Street and 437, 441 and 468 Elizabeth Street have since submitted letters of objection.
