I am contacting you regarding the proposed expansion of the Nelson Aggregate Quarry. I STRONGLY OPPOSE this expansion.

I am fortunate to be living in this area since 1983, our home is located at [REDACTED] I am an active participant in the CLTIP program given that my property is directly adjacent to the Medad Valley Conservation Area and approximately 2 km from the current west end boundary of the quarry.

Since moving here, my wife and I had experienced the tremors of the weekly blasting, questioning if our water well would still function properly from possible shifting of the landform. Our neighbours must obviously have felt similar occurrences.

I take the protection and stewardship of our property under the CLTIP program very seriously giving full awareness and respect to the status and diversity of the flora and fauna unique to the region of Halton and Ontario.
