A by-law to adopt Official Plan Amendment No. 1 to comply with Section 16 (3) of the Planning Act and apply to any land use designation that permits residential uses within the City of Burlington subject to the Burlington Official Plan 2020 File: 505-09/23 (PL-53-23)

Whereas the Council of the Corporation of the City of Burlington in accordance with the provisions of Section 16 and 17 of the Planning Act, 1990, as amended, approved the recommendation in community planning department report PL-53-23 at its meeting held on September 12, 2023.

- 1. That Amendment No. 1 to the Burlington Official Plan (2020) consisting of the attached amendment and supporting documentation is hereby adopted.
- 2. That this by-law shall come into full force and take effect of the final day of passing thereof.

### AMENDMENT NO.1 TO THE OFFICIAL PLAN OF THE CITY OF BURLINGTON, 2020

#### CONSTITUTIONAL STATEMENT

The Amendment contained in Part "B" of this document constitutes Amendment No.1 to the Official Plan of the City of Burlington, 2020.

In accordance with Section 17 (24.1) of the <u>Planning Act</u>, there is no appeal of the Amendment.

### PART A – PREAMBLE

### 1. PURPOSE OF THE AMENDMENT

The purpose of this Official Plan Amendment (OPA) is to amend the policies of the *Burlington Official Plan, 2020,* to implement changes that have been made to the <u>Planning Act</u> resulting from Bill 23, <u>More Homes, Built Faster Act, 2022</u>.

On October 26, 2022, the Province introduced Bill 23, <u>More Homes Built Faster Act,</u> <u>2022</u>, which received Royal Assent on November 28, 2022. The goal of the legislation is to facilitate the construction of 1.5 million new homes in Ontario by 2031. This omnibus bill amended a number of existing statutes including the <u>Planning Act</u>.

The proposed Official Plan Amendment responds to the Bill 23 changes to section 16(3) of the <u>Planning Act</u> by amending the City's Additional Residential Unit policies in subsection 8.7.2: "Additional Residential Units" of the *Burlington Official Plan, 2020.* The amended policies will ensure compliance with section 16(3) of the <u>Planning Act.</u>

### 2. SITE AND LOCATION

The Official Plan Amendment applies to any land use designation that permits residential uses within the City of Burlington subject to the *Burlington Official Plan*.

### 3. BASIS FOR THE AMENDMENT

- a) Bill 23, More Homes Built Faster Act, 2022, received Royal Assent on November 28, 2022.
- b) Schedule 7 of the Bill made changes to Section 16(3) of the Planning Act regarding Additional Residential Units.

- c) Section 17 (24.1) of the <u>Planning Act</u> limits appeal rights for policies that permit additional residential units. As such, subsection 8.7.2 "Additional Residential Units" of the *Burlington Official Plan, 2020* are currently in effect and therefore may be amended.
- d) The Statutory Public Meeting about the Official Plan Amendment will be held on September 12, 2023, including a final recommendation.
