



Why Undertake the Review?

Prepare Council to consider and discuss whether to maintain the existing council composition and ward boundaries or pursue an alternative arrangement.

Objectives of the Review

Fair Representation

Reviewing electoral arrangements can help ensure equal representation and give communities an equitable voice in decision-making processes.

Consider Population and Demographic Changes

A review can align boundaries, reflect population shifts, and better serve evolving community distribution and interests.

Improve Democracy

An independent review promotes transparency and accountability, bolstering trust in the democratic system, and increasing civic engagement.

Legislative Basis

Ontario's *Municipal Act, 2001* authorizes a local municipality to:

Change the size of the Council

- Requirement that there be a minimum of five members, including the head of Council
- No appeal rights associated with executing this authority

Determine how Council (other than the Mayor) will be elected


- May be elected by general vote, wards, or any combination of a general vote and wards
- No appeal rights associated with executing this authority

Divide or re-divide the municipality into wards or dissolve the existing wards

• A by-law adopted by Council is subject to appeal rights

The *Municipal Elections Act, 1996* standardizes key elements:

- Date of elections
- Term of office
- Eligibility




Focus On Burlington

Composition of Council

- Burlington's City Council is unique in Ontario:
 - the six councillors (plus the Mayor) constitute the entire governing body for the City;
 - the six councillors (plus the Mayor) are all members of the governing body of a second municipality; and
 - the Mayor has assigned responsibilities to all six councillors to serve as a Deputy Mayor for particular "portfolios"
 - Council members also serve on a number of local and regional agencies, boards and commissions.
